Families and youth invited to attend focus groups

Every five years, Children's Rehabilitation Service (CRS) conducts a Needs Assessment, which looks at the statewide needs of children and youth with special health care needs and their families.

This year, as in the past several Needs Assessment cycles, Family Voices of Alabama will collaborate with CRS on this process. One way input will be gathered will be through a series of focus groups around the state. Two of these groups will be held in Prattville on Thursday, May 2, at 6 p.m.
